The last tenants of the mill site have made visible progress in vacating the site, including removing an office building by barge. The Cleanup bid documents are out to contractors for bidding, so lots of work is happening behind the scenes, readying for the cleanup. There will be a Tribal Blessing of the Cleanup next Thursday 7/23 at 10 a.m. on the Millsite.
